SPOTLIGHT ON MAISIE HAK AND THE REDWOOD CAREGIVER SUPPORT GROUP

In the heart of Sonoma County, the Redwood Caregiver Resource Center (RCRC) has been a beacon of support for family caregivers facing the emotional, physical, social, spiritual, and financial challenges that often accompany caring for a frail elder or a loved one with an adult-onset brain disorder. At the forefront of this compassionate initiative is Maisie Hak, a dedicated

> social worker and the senior family consultant at RCRC.



led her to a full-time position at RCRC upon her graduation in 2015, where she has since become the senior family consultant.

As a mother of two young children and a secondary family caregiver for a loved one with mixed dementia, Maisie intimately understands the profound impact of caregiving on both individuals and families. Her personal experiences, coupled with her professional expertise, make her a valuable resource for those navigating the challenges of caregiving.

Recognizing the isolating and lonely nature of caregiving, Maisie initiated the Redwood Caregiver Support Group as a lifeline for family caregivers. This group serves as a safe space for caregivers to connect with others facing similar struggles, share experiences, and gain practical tips for coping with challenging situations. The group also provides a wealth of resources to assist caregivers on their journey.

Numerous caregivers have found solace and support through RCRC's caregiver support group and have expressed their gratitude for the services and encouragement provided. Here is what a few attendees had to say:

"The RCRC support group has been very supportive. It has been so helpful for me during this period of caring for my mother! I can't imagine what I would've done without all of the services and support from RCRC staff and other caregivers! Thank you very much for all your

support and encouragement!"

"Thank you for offering . . . the support groups--they made a huge positive difference in my stress level. Just knowing the group and classes are available is 'easing." "Thank you for the RCRC caregiver support group. The wealth of knowledge and resources is so beneficial and meaningful for the group. I appreciate the facilitation so that everyone has time to share even when emotions are high."

In addition to emotional support, RCRC's caregiver support group offers a respite grant for caregivers who need someone to stay with their loved one when they go to the group, offering much-needed relief.

Walk-ins are welcome to the group, but to sign up for a respite grant, family caregivers need to reach out to RCRC at least a week in advance, if they are not yet established with the agency, as an intake and comprehensive assessment with a family consultant are required. Existing clients can coordinate directly with their family consultant.

The group meets in person with Maisie every second Thursday, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm. To sign up for a respite grant, please call 707-582-2329 or email axh@redwoodcrc.org.

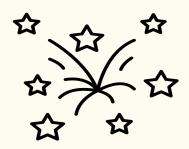

If you don't already have a client, all you need to do is call IHSS Public Authority to get information about how to apply to be on the Registry of Caregivers. You can reach the IHSS Public Authority at 707-565-5700 or at hss-pa@schd.org.

Whether or not you already have a client, once you have contacted IHSS, they will sign you up for the next orientation that they will be holding at the Senior Center, and you can complete your enrollment there.
