The Redwood Empire Food Bank is co-located on site on the first and third Wednesdays from 9:30-11 for a box of perishable and non-perishable foods. Brown bag lunches to go on Wednesday from 11-1, on a first come basis. Sonoma Family Meals in partnership with Backyard Restaurant provide meals on Wednesdays and Fridays on a first-come basis starting at 11am.

Whole Person Care Outreach Worker

Our Peer Outreach Worker works with the Sonoma County Behavioral Health Team, Mobile Support Team and Whole Person Care Team to provide housing, mental health and benefit support to chronically homeless individuals with persistent mental illness.

Full-time Case Manager on-site for all families, including 18 very-low income families already living in the park. Total population of 85 individuals served. Eight additional beds for homeless individuals anticipated in 2021.</p> <p>Rapid Rehousing Providing short-term housing and housing stabilization support to homeless or precariously housed individuals/families. Peer Recovery	<p>WCCS operates two peer-recovery programs in Santa Rosa: Interlink in downtown Santa Rosa and the Wellness & Advocacy Center co-located with the County of Sonoma facility on Challenger Way. These sites aid hundreds of county residents, who are focused on recovery, through peer support and education.</p> <p>In addition, WCCS has Peer Outreach Workers working as partners on the Sonoma County Behavioral Health Mobile Support Team and Whole Person Care Team. The Outreach Workers connect daily to homeless individuals and direct those with severe mental illness to appropriate resources,</p>	<p>WCCS operates the Petaluma Peer Recovery Project in northern Petaluma. This site aids county residents focused on recovery through peer support and education.</p>
